

I would like to commend all our children and their teachers and ANAs for their enthusiasm and commitment to remote learning. Thank you, too, to parents and guardians who are facilitating this and to those who have provided feedback.

Yesterday we had a staff meeting to review the first few days of remote learning. Our aim for this period is to provide a programme which will motivate children and give them a sense of connection to school while at the same time continuing to facilitate their learning. Teachers will speak to children in small groups to ascertain their views. We will, of course, ask parents and guardians for their views in a formal review which will take place when we have given the system a little more time.
