DODDER ACTION DAY IS BACK!

Our all-river clean-up - well, sort of - is finally back on June 26th! We cancelled it last year and this year it didn't run in the spring as it usually does.

No need to explain to you all why this happened. We need to acknowledge that huge numbers of individual volunteers and small local groups have been out cleaning day in, day out, and there are new bins in some areas and more frequent pick -ups by Council teams in some areas too.

The pandemic has provoked a real reckoning with littering on the river. We were all out enjoying the river more than ever and yet the litter, particularly bottles and cans and takeaway wrappers, was far worse than usual because of the closure of bars and restaurants.

DA has been instrumental in campaigning for measures to address the source of some of this litter: we support the element of the Waste Reduction Plan which bans single use plastic in take-aways and brings in deposits on drinks bottles and cans. It seems this may become law before the end of next year. We will be watching but not waiting - we will be campaigning instead!

These measures are long, long overdue and should form part of a war on litter which includes realistic bin provision and a better solution for dog waste than putting it in a plastic bag and then in a bin for archaeologists to mull over in centuries to come (why did they wrap up their dog doings?)
