Current COVID Guidelines for Children under 13 - clarifications on some common questions

If my child tests positive for COVID, what are the implications for their siblings?

Siblings are designated as unvaccinated close contacts in a household setting. As they are unvaccinated, they will have to have PCR (and not antigen) tests. The number of tests needed and number of days during which they will have to restrict their movements will be determined by the contact tracer. **Until you hear from a contact tracer, the siblings should not attend school.**

If my child is symptomatic (even if the symptoms are mild) and going for / awaiting the results of a PCR test, can their siblings attend school?

No, siblings should stay at home until your child receives their test result. If the result is negative, the siblings should return to school. However, if the child still has a non-COVID-related illness, they should stay at home for 48 hours after their symptoms are gone

We have had positive cases of COVID in some classes this week. As you are probably aware, no contact tracing is carried out in schools any longer so no close contacts will be identified. However, it is important to remain vigilant and if your child develops any COVID symptoms, a PCR test should be arranged and they should not come to school while awaiting their result. As a school community, we continue to make every effort to prevent the spread of COVID within the school. Parents / guardians might consider limiting social contacts such as playdates at the present time.
