STAY SAFE LESSONS

All classes are participating in the Stay Safe programme aimed at teaching children personal safety skills. This helps them handle potentially upsetting or dangerous situations, such as getting lost or facing bullying. The programme also covers protection against abuse and stresses telling a trusted adult about any issues.

The Stay Safe programme is part of the SPHE curriculum in all primary schools. Parents/guardians and teachers must collaborate for its success. Parents/guardians should be aware of the lessons to discuss them with their children. Worksheets sent home will outline class topics and offer suggestions to reinforce these messages.

For more details, visit www.staysafe.ie/teachers/resources.htm or contact your child's teacher. This week and next, all classes will begin the 'Touches' module, where children will learn:

- To enjoy normal affection
- The difference between personal and private spaces
- How to respond to unwanted or unsafe touches
- Not to touch others in a way they dislike
- To respect others' boundaries
- It's okay to say 'No' to wrong or dangerous requests, even from adults
- Never to keep secrets about touches.

The Stay Safe Programme

Suggestions for families:

- Talk with your child about the types of touches he or she likes and dislikes.
- Tell your child it is okay to say 'No' if an adult asks them to do something the child feels is dangerous or unsafe.
- Remind your child that it's okay to say 'No' if an adult touches them in a way that the child doesn't like for example, some children don't like being tickled, hugged or kissed by some adults.
- Discuss with your child safe and unsafe touches and the rules they have learned in class: say 'No' get away
 and tell.
- Tell your child never to keep any touch a secret and that they should always tell an adult.

Value of the month: Responsibility

Our value of the month is **Responsibility**, and we are focusing on how this relates to behaviours, respect, and kindness both in class and on the yard. We encourage you to have a conversation with your child at home about the importance of taking responsibility for their actions and treating others with respect and kindness. Please see the playground rules attached for you to refer to during this conversation.
